

UN Women is the new United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (previously known as UNIFEM).

The creation of UN Women came about as part of the UN reform agenda, bringing together resources and mandates for greater impact on gender equality issues in the UN.

UN Women Australia is a voluntary organisation that supports the UN Women's work through raising public awareness in gender and development issues, engages the support of governments and raises funds for selected UN Women projects.

In 2011, the proceeds raised from International Women's Day will go towards UN Women's democratic governance programs which focus on advancing women's leadership and their political participation. This will be achieved through working with multiple stakeholders, like women's organisations, governments, the UN system and the private sector, to bring more women into government, train women leaders and boost women's skills to actively participate in elections as candidates and voters.

Guest Speaker – Justice Unity Dow



In 2011 we welcome Unity Dow who is a human rights activist, lawyer and writer from Botswana. In 1998, she was the first female justice appointed to the High Court of Botswana after a distinguished legal career in which she advocated for the rights of women and indigenous groups. Most noteworthy was her advocacy in High Court case The Attorney General v Unity Dow ("The Citizenship Case"). She successfully challenged the

constitutionality of the Citizenship Act that refused to recognise her children as Botswana citizens because her husband was a foreigner. The effect of this landmark case was to extend constitutional protections against discrimination against women, and enable land rights and property to pass down through the maternal line. Dow's advocacy was also responsible for Botswana courts recognising the defence of battered women syndrome in criminal cases concerning domestic violence victims, and requiring fathers to uphold child support for non-marital children.

In addition to this eminent legal career, Dow is renowned as a novelist having authored five books. Her books deal with problems endemic in Africa including aids, poverty women's rights and the tension between Western and traditional values. Her service to minority groups was recognised by French President Nicolas Sarkozy when she was awarded the French Medal of the Legion d'Honneur de France in July 2010.

MC - Philippa McDonald

Philippa McDonald is a senior reporter for ABC TV News responsible for covering major stories.

She is an award-winning journalist who has worked across the breadth of ABC News and Current Afffairs programs including the 7:00pm news, The 7.30 Report, Lateline, Foreign Correspondent, radio news, AM, PM and The World Today.

Philippa has reported for the ABC from throughout Australia and abroad from Indonesia, Thailand, China, Burma, Cambodia, Fiji and New Zealand. Her report on the plight of the internally displaced people in Burma and Karen refugees seeking a new life in Australia won the United Nations Association Media Peace Prize for Television Current Affairs.

She has also won the Donald McDonald Reuters Scholarship to Oxford University. Philippa studied India's emergence as a world power.
